Dear Rick, I've been thinking about the questions you raised at the October meeting of the IT group and would like to suggest some solutions:

How to make a PDF file from documents and photos

It is quite simple to do, although it is hidden from any obvious user interaction. I've just tried it out and it works. You can also convert files into PDF via Acrobat.

Advice on photo apps to improve on the Apple offering

The Article is called "10 Best Photo Editing Apps for iPad" Why not try 'Adobe Photoshop Express' and/or Google 'Snapseed'. They are both free. I've used Snapseed and it is very good. There is also VSCO, again free.

The best approach is to stick with one app until you are very familiar with the way it works.

Replacement for Picassa

This is more of a difficult subject to deal with. I guess you have already thought of using 'Google Photos'. This has unlimited storage and is free! Files are limited to 16 megapixels but this is not really much of a drawback. Have you considered 'Flickr': https://www.flickr.com

There is also Dropbox, although this not free.

Advice on drawing apps

I'm guessing that you have bought Apple Pencil? This comes with a drawing app does it not? What about Adobe 'Photoshop Sketch'? I think this is free app. Have a look at: https://www.digitalartsonline.co.uk/features/illustration/best-apps-for-drawing-painting-on-ipad/
